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

If there are not 3 horses in 1 D will pay out top 6 horse times.

Competitor must ride in all 3 events and also ride the same horse in all 3 events, no exceptions. Horse can't be ridden again by any other contestant. Any competitor getting a no time for broken pattern is disqualified for top gun awards.

To enter you must call in Monday, July 12, 6-8 p.m. Phone 309-547-3748. 1 entry per call. Contestant can only enter one time. Fulton County residents will be given priority spots. Out of county entries will be put on waiting list and you will be contacted if entry spot opens up. If for any reason you need to withdraw your entry, please call Fair office ASAP. You must call Fulton County Fair Office before 4 p.m. Monday, July 19, to get a refund of your entry.

\$40 Entry payment must be at Fair Office by July 16 or you lose your entry spot. The committee will then contact a waiting list contestant to add entries. Fair office is open 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday-Friday.

Coggins will be checked at check-in table night of event. We will draw at check-in table for running order for each event. Enter fairgrounds by horse barns/horse arena, do not use main fairgrounds entrance. Check in is 5 p.m. day of event over at horse arena/horse barn area. Trailers can be moved to infield after harness racing is completed. No horses will be allowed in infield of fairgrounds until harness racing is over, no exceptions. Horses may be ridden in horse arena.

Events will be ran in this order: Flags, Poles, Barrels. Arena Drag will be after 10 horses run, Big Drags between each event. 5 seconds added to constant run for each down barrel or pole, 5 seconds added to flag time for no pick and/or no stick.

Competitors must wear collared shirt, cowboy hat/helmet, boots.

If raining, call fair office to check status of event. The event will be ran even if ground is wet and/or muddy.

Crowd favorite will also receive additional prize money. Crowd favorite can be determined by text and cheering. Text # will be announced the evening at the event. Bring plenty of fans to cheer for you.

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
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Rules & Regulations

- 1. The general supervision of the grounds and the entire exhibition is vested in a Board of Directors.
- 2. The order of the President and Secretary will be executed by the Marshal and Committee of Grounds and Privileges, who have immediate charge of the grounds and assign such aids to Superintendents of Divisions as may be required, receive exhibitors on their arrival and direct them to their proper place, and see that none of the rules are violated.
- ** Due to budget problems premiums will be paid when money comes available from the State of Illinois.

Entries

3. Exhibitors of Automobiles, Machinery, etc. will be allotted space on applying to Superintendent of these departments.

IMPORTANT


- 4. Competitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to whatever they may have on exhibition, and at the close of the Fair take charge of same.
- 5. Diligence will be used by the officers of the board to prevent injury or loss of articles or animals on exhibition, but the Board will not be responsible for any loss that may occur.

AWARDING COMMITTEE

- 6. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judges, during the judging process, will be promptly excluded from competition. Questions may be asked at the conclusion of judging. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 7. Protests against awards of judges must be submitted to the Superintendent, in writing, with sufficient reasons given.
- 8. The judges will report only the articles entitled to premiums in the regular list, except they may especially commend such others as may be deemed worthy of recommendation.
- 9. Should any doubt arise as to regularity of entry or any other important matter, which the judges feel incompetent to decide, they shall at once report the same to the superintendent of the proper department for decision.
- 10. Great care must be exercised to preserve the awarding judges' books, and the awards must be entered as above in plain, legible manner in the proper place, and the premiums will be paid on the authority of the entries only.
- 11. Superintendents will be particular to observe the following rules: Blue ribbons are designed for first premiums; Red ribbons for second premiums; White ribbons for third premiums; Pink ribbons for fourth premiums; Yellow ribbons for fifth premiums; Green ribbons for sixth premiums and Chartreuse ribbons for seventh premiums. They shall be affixed to the exhibit at the time of judging. Participation ribbons are available for all exhibits not placing. These are available upon request at the secretary's office.
- 12. Awards will be made by the single judge system; said several judges to be appointed by the Board of Directors and to report to the superintendent of respective departments at the time of the day affixed for awarding premiums on the lots on which they are respectively to judge. Objections to any person serving as judge must be submitted to the Superintendent, in writing, before making any awards, giving good and sufficient reason. Superintendents shall have the full power to act.
- 13. Decision of the judges shall be final except in case of fraud or protest. If any award is treated in contemptuous manner or ribbon torn off, the premium shall be forfeited.
- 14. Each Superintendent shall give instruction to the awarding judges before entering upon the performance of his duties as will enable him to decide all questions that may come in for consideration, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Association.
- 15. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent to have all awards complete no later than Saturday, July 31, 4:00 p.m.
- 16. All premiums will be paid by check.
- 17. All bills against the association must be itemized and presented to the Secretary without delay.
- 18. Delivery wagons will be charged for entering the grounds and must obtain a permit from the Superintendent of Concessions.
- 19. No buses or public conveyances will be allowed on the grounds, without special permission from the board of directors.
- 20. An efficient police force will be on duty day and night.
- 21. No persons will be permitted to remain on the grounds overnight except those holding special permits or exhibitors' tickets.
- 22. All subjects not embodied in these rules shall be determined by the Board of Directors, whose decisions shall be final.
- 23. Any person who by fraud or misrepresentation shall secure any privilege on the grounds, shall, upon the discovery of such fraud or misrepresentation, be ejected from the grounds and forfeit all rights to such privileges and to all sums paid therefore.
- 24. If animals occupying stalls of the Association are not exhibited in the ring at the time appointed for exhibition of the class or lot in which they are entered, owner will be charged \$1.00 per day for each stall and animals are not to be permitted to be removed until said rent is paid.
- 25. All health papers will be checked before animals will be penned.
- 26. All applications for renting refreshment stands, display space, space for show, etc., must be made to Victor Miller, P.O. Box 167, Lewistown, IL 61542, 547-2532. Ground rent for booths, etc., shall be established by the Superintendent of Concessions. When a lot or piece of ground shall be rented, the Superintendent of Concessions or Assistant Superintendent of Concessions shall make a lease in duplicate, both to be signed by himself and lessee, one for the lessee, the other to be given to or retained by the Secretary. The balance to become due and payable on Monday, July 26, 2021. The Superintendent of Concessions and Assistant Superintendent are to keep an account of all leases turned over to the Secretary and make a detailed statement of same in their annual report. Four admission tickets will be allowed with each concession privilege.
- 27. Advertising in the exhibit building, livestock barns and tents will not be permitted.
- 28. The Fair Association, at the discretion of the superintendent of concessions, reserves the right to sell exclusive rights for any soft drink, food, or concession.

OBJECTIONAL FEATURES

29. It will be useless to write or apply for privileges for gambling devices, questionable shows, or other objectionable features, as the same will not be allowed upon the grounds.

2021 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements - County Fairs

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

- 1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits. All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at (217) 782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php
- 2. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.
- 3. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.
- 4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
- 5. CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
- 6. CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
- 7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise. Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds. Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.
- 8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. New examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at any time while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit. The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.
- 9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited. Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.
- 10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

The following is a brief summary of Health Requirements for the Fulton County Fair for Illinois livestock. Refer to the entire Exhibition Requirement for additional information and for out of state livestock.

A) Cattle

- 1. Permanent individual identification: official metal ear tag healed tattoo
- 2. Female cattle over 6 months need a Health Certificate
- 3. Steers and calves under 6 months do not need a Health Certificate

B) Swine

- 1. Permanent individual identification: official metal ear tag healed tattoo, healed ear notch
- 2. Pseudorabies test within 90 days of exhibition or originate immediately from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd
- 3. The use of ear notches is not acceptable as official identification for crossbred swine.

C) Sheep

- 1. Permanent individual ID: scrapie tag, breed tattoo, microchip
- 2. Market lambs slick shorn
- 3. Health Certificates must include flock of birth and flock or origin if different

D) Goats

- 1. Permanent individual ID: scrapie tag, breed tattoo, microchip, metal tag
- 2. Health Certificate must include flock of birth and flock or origin if different
-) Horses and Ponies
 - 1. All horse and ponies over 12 months of age must have a negative coggins (EIA) conducted within 12 months.
 - 2. No health paper is required
- F) Poultry
 - 1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorumtyphoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
- G) Rabbits
 - 1. No requirements for moving within Illinois

CATTLE

IDENTIFICATION

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

ILLINOIS CATTLE

Brucellosis – Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis – Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State, Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at (217) 782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

BRUCELLOSIS

- 1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
 - C. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified)
 - D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
- 2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

TUBERCULOSIS

- Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
- 2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibition.
 - C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

ILLINOIS SWINE

IDENTIFICATION

- 1. Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
- 2. Ear notch identification is acceptable for all barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine. (Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)

BRUCELLOSIS

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine.

PSEUDORABIES

Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

OUT-OF-STATE SWINE

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at (217) 782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

IDENTIFICATION

- 1. Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
- 2. Ear notch identification **is not** acceptable for crossbred animals.

BRUCELLOSIS

- 1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
- 2. Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

PSEUDORABIES

- 1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
- 2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
- 3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies State I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
- 4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

IDENTIFICATION – Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader. Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal. When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

MARKET LAMBS

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

ILLINOIS SHEEP

- 1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2020, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

OUT-OF-STATE SHEEP

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at (217) 782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- 1 Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- 3. For any animal born after 1/1/2020, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

IDENTIFICATION – Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader. Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal. When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database. Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

ILLINOIS GOATS

- 1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
- 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2020, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

OUT-OF-STATE GOATS

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at (217) 782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- 1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
- 2. Tuberculosis Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. For any animal born after 1/1/2019, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

HORSE, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

ILLINOIS EQUINE

- 1. All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- 3. An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
- 4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

OUT-OF-STATE EQUINE

All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at (217) 782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- 1. All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- 3. All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

POULTRY

- 1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
- 2. Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
- 3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
- 4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds.
- 5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.
- 6. A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. A permit may be obtained by calling (217) 782-4944.

Please note: These poultry exhibition requirements do not apply to 4-H and FFA 1-day poultry shows where the entries are taken to the show and returned home the same day. However, a permit is required for out-of-state poultry.

CERVIDAE

(Deer, Elk, Reindeer, Caribou, Moose, Red Deer and other Related Species)

IDENTIFICATION – All animals shall be individually identified with an approved tag, microchip or tattoo. Elk are required to have two official/approved unique identifiers.

ILLINOIS CERVIDAE

CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE

For cervidae changing ownership or moving within the State, the owner must obtain a permit issued by the Department prior to movement and the cervid must originate from a herd that is enrolled in the Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program or the Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Program. The permit shall be obtained no more than 72 hours in advance of the movement of the cervids by providing the following information:

- A) Name and complete mailing address of person exhibiting the cervids;
- B) Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease or Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Herd number;
- C) Name and complete mailing address of location where the animals will be exhibited;
- D) Number of animals and unique identification of the animals.

TUBERCULOSIS

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin test is not required for Illinois cervidae.

OUT-OF-STATE CERVIDAE

CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE

- 1. All cervidae entering Illinois must be in compliance with the Illinois Wildlife Code [520 ILSC 5]. For more information, contact the Illinois Department of Natural Resources at (217) 782-6384.
- 2. All cervidae entering Illinois must be accompanied by a permit from the Department and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that:
 - a. has been issued by an accredited veterinarian of the state of origin or a veterinarian in the employ of the United States Department of Agriculture;
 - b. is approved by the Animal Health Official of the state of origin;
 - c. shows that the cervidae are free from visible evidence of any contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto, do not originate from a CWD endemic area (any county and surrounding counties where CWD has been diagnosed in the past five years);
 - d. shows that the cervidae are not originating from a herd under quarantine for any contagious, infectious or communicable disease;
 - e. shows that the animals originate from a herd that has been monitored for at least 5 years under a state-approved CWD certification program.
- 3. A permit number can be obtained by calling (217) 782-4944. Applicant for permit shall furnish the following information to the Department:
 - a. Name and post office mailing address of Illinois destination;
 - b. Name and post office mailing address of the consignor and/or source herds;
 - c. Name and post office mailing address of the herd veterinarian;
 - d. Number and unique identification of cervidae in shipment.

BRUCELLOSIS

Cervidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative brucellosis card or PCFIA test within sixty (60) days prior to entry.

TUBERCULOSIS

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States

All cervidae twelve (12) months of age and over shall be negative to two (2) single cervical test for bovine TB no less than ninety (90) days apart with the second test conducted within ninety (90) days prior to entry. These animals shall be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period unless they originate from an accredited, qualified or monitored herd.

- A. Cervidae from an accredited herd may be moved into Illinois without further TB testing provided that a certificate stating that such cervids originated from an accredited herd accompanies them.
- B. Cervidae originating from qualified or monitored herds may enter with a negative test within ninety (90) days prior to entry and a certificate stating that the animals originate from a monitored herd.
- 2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. All cervidae shall originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to two (2) additional tuberculin tests conducted within 180 and 30 days prior to entry or exhibition.

RATITES

(Ostriches, Emus, Rheas, Cassowaries and Kiwis)

ILLINOIS RATITES

There are no requirements governing the movement of ratites within Illinois.

OUT-OF-STATE RATITES

- 1. Must be accompanied by a CVI and permit number. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at (217) 782-4944.
- 2. Individually identified by leg band or microchip.
- 3. Negative test for Avian Influenza within 10 days prior to entry.

PIGEONS

There are no requirements governing the movements of pigeons within or into Illinois.

RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

LLAMAS

There are no requirements governing the movement of Ilamas within Illinois. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state Ilamas. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., at (217) 782-4944. To Be Held At Lewistown Fair Grounds July 26 – July 31

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

(please read rules for each class)

No livestock will be penned before 2:00 p.m., Monday, July 26

- 1. The Livestock Department (Beef Cattle, Swine, Sheep, Rabbit, Poultry and Goats) will be an open Junior Show only. It is open to all persons 8 years of age as of September 1, 2020, or in third grade and must not have reached their 19th birthday as of September 1, 2020 and residing in Fulton County, or attending a Fulton County School District, or who are serviced by a Fulton County 4-H Club or FFA chapter, that overlap in surrounding counties. The Agricultural Products Department, Corn, Grain, Flowers, Fine Arts and Culinary will be open to adults as well as juniors in the area as described above. Individuals previously enrolled as active members in Illinois FFA programs and turning 19-20 years of age by September 1, 2020 may participate in the Junior Livestock Division of the Fulton County Fair only if they are active FFA members as verified by Illinois FFA and in accordance with one of the following program options:
 - Maintain active membership on the roster of their local high school FFA Chapter;
 - · Maintain active membership in a collegiate FFA Chapter in a post-secondary institution of higher education in the State of Illinois; or
 - · Maintain active membership in an Illinois FFA Alumni Chapter.

FFA members 21 years of age prior to September 1, 2020 are ineligible to show in the Junior Livestock Division of the Fulton County Fair.

- 2. **All livestock entries must be mailed not later than July 1, 2021 at 4:00 p.m.** These entries are to be made at the Extension office or directly to the Secretary of the Fulton County Fair and Racing Association, Box 167, Lewistown, Illinois 61542, and no entries will be accepted after the above mentioned date. **This rule is final and no exceptions will be made by orders of the Department of Agriculture.**
- 3. All rabbits and poultry to be penned by 7:00 p.m., Monday, July 26. All other animals to be placed and ready for exhibit by 7:00 a.m., Tuesday, July 27.
- 4. All vegetables and grains are to be in place and ready for judging by 9:30 a.m. Tuesday. Also all other Foods & Baked Goods, Class O & P, except Food Preservation must be in place by 9:00 a.m. Tuesday. All Textiles & Fine Arts classes, Handicraft, Class Q, all other Junior Dept. Class P and all Food Preservation are to be in place by 9:00 a.m. Wednesday. Flowers Class L are to be in place and ready for judging by 10:00 a.m. Thursday.
- 5. All livestock, poultry and rabbits must remain in place on exhibition until 7:00 a.m. on Friday, July 30, 2021. All General Exhibits, Floral Hall and Agriculture Products must remain on exhibit until 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, July 31, 2021. Trucks entering the grounds after that time will be admitted free to pick up exhibits. Note: Early release to go to another fair is not allowed, nor is the superintendent allowed to release early. Premiums will be in jeopardy if these rules are not adhered to.
- 6. In the following special rules which precede the various show selections, the lettered sections refer to the department; the number sections refer to the classes.
- 7. Protests against awards of the judges must be submitted to the Superintendent, in writing, with sufficient reasons given.
- 8. No single exhibit may be shown in more than one individual class.
- 9. Exhibitors please notice: All animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name only.
- 10. Registration papers will be required to be with animals when it enters show ring. These will be spot checked.
- 11. The Association reserves the sole and absolute right to interpret all rules. (Also to refuse and cancel any entry, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award of prizes and declare show off if deemed advisable without claim for damages.)
- 12. Only exhibitors, or persons authorized by the Fair Board and Livestock Committee Chairman, will be permitted in the livestock areas or truck parking area from 12 midnight to 6 a.m.
- 13. Boys only will be permitted to stay overnight on the grounds. They will be responsible to adult supervisors for their conduct during the Fair. Those staying must provide a cot, necessary sleeping gear, etc. They must be in by 12:00 midnight and up and dressed by 7:00 a.m. There will be no leaving of the fairgrounds by those quartered in the area after 12:00 midnight without permission of the Livestock Committee Chairman. Boys 10 years and under must be accompanied by a parent if staying on the grounds all night.
- 14. Any questions about weights of any animal must be made at time of weighing. It is the responsibility of exhibitor and three other people, not relatives of the exhibitor, and presented to the Secretary of the Fulton County Fair and Racing Association 24 hours before they are exhibited. Protest must be accompanied by a \$25.00 deposit.
- 15. If it is necessary for someone else to show your animal you must report to your superintendent in the department and it is up to the discretion of the Fair Board as to whether it will be allowed.
- 16. In all Rate of Gain classes State Fair Rules and Regulations will apply.
- 17. No livestock will be penned before 2:00 p.m. Monday, July 26, 2021.
- 18. No livestock after 10:00 p.m. Monday to 7:00 a.m. Tuesday morning. Must be in pen by 7:00 a.m.
- 19. All Feed for livestock must be brought in before 9:00 a.m. each day. No trucks will be allowed across the tracks after that time.
- 20. There will be no coloring or dyeing in beef, sheep, swine, rabbits, chickens, ducks, horses, and goats.
- 21. All pens must be cleaned before exhibitor leaves.
- 22. Health papers must be turned in to superintendent before unloading animals.
- 23. ONLY BEDDING OF PENS AND DELIVERY OF TACK ON SUNDAY, JULY 25, 2021 FROM 5:00 P.M. TO 9:00 P.M. ONLY AND THEN STARTING AGAIN ON MONDAY, JULY 26, 2021 AT 2:00 P.M. WHEN ANIMALS CAN START COMING IN.
- 24. SCRAMBLE CALVES CAUGHT IN LAST YEAR'S SCRAMBLE WILL BE SHOWN WEDNESDAY IN THE LIVESTOCK ARENA.

- 1. This class is governed by the above general rules.
- 2. State of Illinois Health Rules will be applied in this show to female beef animals.
- 3. All Health Papers will be checked by the beef superintendents before cattle are unloaded.
- 4. Superintendents will determine time and order of processing. All animals in recorded classes must have registration papers from the proper breed associations in the exhibitor's name. The papers will be checked at the time of processing. All steers, market heifers, and unrecorded heifers will be weighed on Association scales. Any objection of weight must be made at the time of weighing.
- 5. Tattoos must be legible and fully healed.
- 6. Double entries are permitted in the beef show, but limited to six steers per exhibitor.
- 7. Breeding heifers must have been dropped on or after Sept. 1, 2019 and no later than March 1, 2021. Beef steers and market heifers must have been dropped after Jan. 1, 2020. The animals must be the property of the exhibitors by May 1, 2021.
- 8. Livestock Auction cattle must be designated and weighed at the time of processing. Only cattle born in 2020 will be eligible for the auction.
- 9. An additional class will be provided for calves won in the Calf Scramble for trophy only. Scramble calves must remain on the grounds through Friday, July 30, until released by fair.
- 10. All cattle must be haltered and tied with a neck rope.
- 11. All market animals must be dehorned.
- 12. No additional stall fees on pairs.
- 13. Breeding heifers will be divided into classes of Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, Simmental, All Other Breeds, and Unrecorded. All Other Breeds females will consist of any recorded heifers that are not registered as a purebred Angus, Hereford, or Shorthorn or a registered Simmental.
- 14. All Champion heifers will show for the Grand Champion Female.
- 15. All cows in the cow and calf division will be British Breed, Recorded AOB, or Unrecorded. Exhibitor must be the owner of the cow at time of conception of the calf. All cows and calves will be halter broke and only one entry per exhibitor.
- 16. All class winners in the registered Angus division are eligible for blood typing in accordance with the American Angus Association.
- 17. If there are fewer than 3 entries in breeding classes, entries can be moved into another class at the discretion of the superintendent.
- 18. Market animals may be mouthed to verify age. The animal may not have more than one pair of milk teeth replaced by permanent teeth, and both permanent teeth cannot be advanced enough to be in wear. If the veterinarian or authorized person finds the animal over-age, the Association may disgualify the animal and the decision will be final.
- 19. For all pair classes, one entry per exhibitor and they must own both calves.
- 20. Each exhibitor will be limited to one entry in rate of gain.
- 21. Purebred steers will consist of Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, or White Park. AOB steer will consist of all other registered steers. All other steers will be crossbred.
- 22. All Classes will be determined after the Superintendents have processed all animals.
- 23. **Jr. Showmanship:** 13 yrs. and under, Kiesewetter Angus will sponsor cash placing of \$50, \$30, \$20. **Sr. Showmanship:** 14 yrs. and older. Youngsters showing in the Sunrise Farm Special are not eligible for showmanship classes. Winners of previous Jr. Showmanship classes must move up to Sr. Showmanship. Winners of previous Sr. Showmanship are ineligible to compete. The superintendents will announce when showmanship classes will take place. Sunrise Farm Special will take place at 1:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 28.
- 24. Superintendents can use any stall unoccupied by an animal, if they deem necessary, without refunds.
- 25. Only one fan for every three head of cattle. Hanging fans only.
- 26. Grooming chutes must be kept inside of the barns until 2 p.m. Monday, July 26, 2021.
- 27. Extra Stalls: Please request only the number of extra stalls as follows per exhibitor: 1-3 head = 1 extra stall, 4-6 head = 2 extra stalls, 7-9 head = 3 extra stalls, and 10-12 head = 4 extra stalls. If there are not enough extra stalls for the exhibitor as requested, we will have to reduce the number of extra stalls bought with a refund due to you at the Fair Office.







- 5. All swine exhibited at the Fulton County Fair must have been inspected by a veterinarian and have a valid set of current health papers.
- 6. All crossbred barrows must be farrowed on or after Jan. 1, 2021. Except rate of gain barrows must be farrowed on or after Feb. 10, 2021, which is also a State Fair Guideline. All crossbred gilts must be farrowed after Jan. 1, 2021.
- 7. All Swine Show exhibitions must be property of the exhibitor as of May 1, 2021.
- 8. All animals must be ear notched, ear notches must be legible and fully healed.
- 9. All purebred pedigrees will be checked and/or collected to determine classes. Purebred gilts must be farrowed on or after Jan. 1, 2021. Purebred litters must be determined at check-in.

Fulton County Fair Livestock Auction

Craig McCoy • 3:00 p.m., Thursday, July 29, 2021

- 1. The livestock sale will be held at 3:00 p.m. Thursday afternoon of the County Fair.
- 2. The starting site of the sale will be the cattle or swine show ring depending on the sale order of the species.
- 3. The sale order will rotate each year between sheep, hogs and cattle.
- 4. Intent to sell will be submitted at the same time as County Fair entries. Specific animals to sell will be identified at the County Fair weigh in. The auction is optional; exhibitors are not required to sell their market animals at the County Fair.
- 5. Exhibitors may sell two animals with only one of those animals being a calf.
- 6. Fees will be collected in the amounts of \$25.00 per steer, \$20.00 per pig and \$10.00 per lamb. This amount will be automatically deducted from the exhibitor's sale check.
- 7. For a calf, pig or lamb to be eligible for the sale it must meet the following qualifications:
 - Must meet the entry qualifications and be exhibited at the Fulton County Fair.
 - Must be shown at one other county show. (Cuba, Farmington or Fairview)
- 8. County Fair check in weight will be used as the animal sale weight.
- 9. Sale order within each species will be determined by a random drawing with special recognition given to the champions and reserve champions if sold.
- 10. The buyer will not take ownership of the animal. The buyer will pay the difference between the "day's set market price" and the auction price. It will be the responsibility of the seller to market the animal. If the buyer wants possession of the animal for butchering purposes, that decision is between the buyer and the 4-H member.
- 11. All checks will be post dated for after the State Fair Livestock Shows.

- 3. An exhibitor is limited to one exhibit in each class, and entries may not be combined to be judged again as a group.
- 4. Fair will furnish containers for single variety vegetables and fruit entries. Exhibitors tags must be firmly attached to exhibits.
- 5. The market basket J-14-814 entry will consist of one bushel or one-half bushel **ROUND BASKET ONLY**, as the exhibitor sees fit, of vegetables from the exhibitor's garden. They will be judged on appearance, quality, arrangement, and balance selection. Decorating of the basket is at the exhibitor's discretion.
- 6. Pods should be left on all pod beans and pole beans. **Approximately one to one and one-half inch of tops should be left on beets, carrots, onions, and horseradish.** Onions should not be peeled. Husk should be left on sweet corn with an inch window cut on one ear of sweet corn exhibit. Stems should be left on tomato exhibits.
- 7. All vegetables and fruit should be clean, but NO waxes or oil shall be used.
- 8. Group display exhibits J-14-807 and J-14-808 are required to be displayed in cut down box or a small basket (decorating of box or basket is at discretion of exhibitor) and shall consist of 5 to 8 or 9 to 12 different vegetables and number of specimens must be the same as listed for individual classes. For example: 5 red potatoes, 1 cabbage, 12 green beans, 5 red onions, 8 yellow cherry tomatoes, etc.
- 9. Samples of grain seed and seed will be 1 full gallon. Exhibitor must furnish own container.
- 10. Wheat and Oats will be judged as current crop.
- 11. Corn will be judged as commercial crop.



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

2021 RULES for Farmer Classes Only

- Contest limited to rubber-tired tractors, no tire chains, rear duals or four-wheel drives allowed.
- All forms of nitromethane are illegal (including nitrous oxide) as a fuel or fuel additive. Legal fuels are: diesel fuel, pump gas or L.P. gas. NO WATER OR ALCOHOL is permitted.
- Tractors may enter only once in each class, but may pull in two classes.
- Weight includes driver. All weight must be bolted or securely fastened to tractor. Front weight cannot extend more than 24" in front of tractors; rear weights cannot interfere with hitching device or sled.
- 5. Each tractor will have the stock draw bar. Hitch may not be more than 20" from top of hitch point and locked in place. Hitch point may not be closer than 18" from the center of rear wheels. Draw bar cannot be connected to the hydraulic system in any way. No excessive jerking when started or during pull. Pull is ended when all forward motion stops (no excessive hold digging is allowed). A hitch will be provided to hook from tractor to sled.
- All field stock tractors must be factory original models or have factory replacement parts.
- 7. Tire size is limited to 20.8x?
- 8. One turbo TO-4 or brand equivalent.
- 9. Stock fuel system for make and model. No exceptions!
- 10. No excessive stripping of weight is allowed.

- 11. All exhaust must be discharged upwards. No rain caps or curved pipes.
- 12. A tractor that does not go 75 feet will be given a second chance, except on pull offs when a tractor has only one attempt.
- 13. Contest will be governed by a judge or judges, with all decisions final. Judge will have the right to stop and disqualify any contestant's tractor that is being operated in an unsafe manner. Also if for any of these other reasons as follows:
 - a) driver does not remain seated
 - b) loss of weight from the point of pulling on the track (across white line) until ending pull and pulling off (past white line)
 - c) loss of any safety equipment
 - d) loss of any shielding
 - e) any time tractor or sled is outside of pulling track
 - f) if any contestant shows any unsportsmanlike conduct
 - g) if any driver has consumed any alcoholic beverage before or during the contest
 - h) all drivers must wear shirt, pants and shoes before they will be allowed to compete
- R.P.M.s for all tractors shall not exceed factory R.P.M.s for 6 cyl., 2500 R.P.M.s for 4 cyl. and 1500 R.P.M.s for 2 cyl. engines.
- 15. All tractors will be weighed by 5:00 p.m. that day at Fairgrounds and weighed before line up.
- 16. Judges decisions are final.

In fairness to all contestants, the following rules and regulations will be STRICTLY enforced and hoods will be opened for inspection. American cars or station wagons allowed as factory equipped. No jeeps, trucks, carryalls, Imperials, convertibles or hearses. No 1969 or older Lincoln Continentals. No Imperial sub-frames allowed on cars. No '03 and newer Fords.

Compact cars will use the same rules as the stock class. Compacts MUST NOT exceed 110" wheel base and be a factory 4 or 6 cylinder.

Participation Regulations

Drivers may maneuver in any direction hitting other active cars once every minute or less. Driver's door hits are not allowed. You get one warning and then are disqualified. Two fires and you will be disqualified. Helmet, long sleeves, and adequate eye protection MUST be worn. At least a lap-type seat belt must be worn. **NO ALCOHOL OR DRUGS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE PIT AREA. VIOLATORS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

Stock Class Rules

- 1. All glass, chrome, pot metal, lights, carpet, backseats, head liners, fiberglass, anything flammable (except front seat) must be removed before reaching the exhibit area. Do not break glass down in doors. Trunks must be empty of all debris, spare parts, tires, rims, etc. Station wagon rear decking and seats must be removed.
- 2. Batteries must be placed in secure position and **MUST** be covered with rubber floor mat or something nonflammable. Battery must be securely fastened down. Your battery must not move when checked. No battery packs.
- 3. Stock gas tank **MUST** be removed. **NO FACTORY GAS TANKS. NO PLASTIC TANKS.** The only exception is a bought racing fuel cell. Tank must be mounted in rear seat area either on the seat bar of cage or on the floor and be bolted down with metal straps. No ratchet straps, bungee cords, plumbers strap, or metal screws. All tanks MUST be covered with a rubber cover or something non-flammable. All tanks MUST have secure cap. All lines and fittings MUST be leak proof and meet approval of Officials.
- 4. Absolutely NO Frame Welding, Tilting, or Cold Bending. You are allowed 4 patch plates. Plates must not exceed 4"x6" 1/8" thick. Must be a visible bend or it will be removed! Welds on plates must have at least a 1/2" gap between them. If using plates for rust repair DO NOT cut the rust out; weld the plate over the top. Paint all plates orange so we can see them easily. You can shorten front frame but have to have 1" in front of core support mount in the factory position.
 - Hoods and trunks. Hoods must be in the stock location. Hoods may use two (2) pieces of 3/4" max. all-thread through the radiator support and body mount with washers no larger than six (6) inches diameter. Spacer must not exceed three (3) inches in diameter or four (4) inches tall from bottom of core support to top of frame. In addition to all-thread hoods will be allowed 6 pieces of #9 wire, 4 loops per wrap. Hoods may have up to ten (10) 3/8" max. bolts with washers no larger than 1 inch diameter per header hole. Trunks must have 50% in stock location. Trunks may have 6 pieces of #9 wire, 4 loops per wrap. NO all thread through trunk lid. All wire must be sheet metal to sheet metal.



- Core support must remain in factory location and orientation.
- 7. **Body mounts.** You may replace six (6) body mounts of your choice (radiator support counts in your six). Bolts no larger than 3/4" with washers no larger than four (4) inches. **WASHERS MUST BE INSIDE FRAME. Must have a minimum of 1 inch spacer between body and frame.**
- 8. **Doors.** You can weld a total of 12 inches per vertical door seam (NOT window pillars) 3" x 1/8" max. strapping, and 6 pieces of #9 wire or 3/8 chain max. You are allowed a 3/16" thick door skin on the front doors ONLY. **MUST NOT OVERLAP DOOR SEAM.**
- 9. **Drive train.** Any engine and tranny in any car. May weld engine mounts to engine cradle only DO NOT exceed factory installation. You may weld a 6" long piece of angle iron 1/4" max. thickness to the frame to attach a stock cross member or 2"x2" angle iron to. You may use after market pedals and drive shaft. You may use a lower engine cradle only with pully protector and front plate NO other protectors allowed. If you have a pully protector you must cut the sway bar out. Rear ends must be a factory 5 lug rear end with NO bracing. 31 spline axles max. with cast flanges. No floater rear ends. Top finishers will be checked before payout.
- 10. Driver's safety cage A four pipe or bar cage may be placed around the driver's compartment. Cage material must not be bigger than 6" diameter. Cage may be welded or bolted in NO down tubes. Will not extend in front of firewall or more than 12" behind driver's seat. A gas tank protector is allowed but must be attached to rear seat bar

- and be no more than 24" wide, must be at least 2" from rear sheet metal of car. You may wire or chain cage to frame in 4 spots inside of car. 3/8 chain max. links must not be welded together. No grader blades or bars on outside of car. **THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**
- 11. Bumpers are interchangeable but must be a car bumper. Bumpers may be loaded. Bumpers may be welded to shock cans only, shock cans may be collapsed and welded. Bumpers may be hard nosed. You may weld brackets to frame **DO NOT** weld anything behind the core support body mount. You may use one (1) piece of chain per side bolted to help secure the bumper. You may use (6) loops of #9 wire from radiator support to bumper outboard of radiator. Nothing added in front of radiator.
- 12. Tires Fifteen (15) inch max. tires of any make or manufacture may be used. Valve stem protectors are okay. No split rims. No bead protectors.
- 13. Bolts holding fender to fender well will be allowed. No more than ten (10) per fender this includes quarter panel 3/8" diameter bolt max. with 1" washer allowed. Doors and body cavities may not be filled.
- 14. A minimum of 1 maximum of 2 bars from firewall to roof in center of car is required. No cross connections. Windshield bars can't be more than 3" wide, 5" on firewall and 5" on roof max. No rear window bars.
- 15. Steering columns may be after market. No hydraulic steering. All other steering and suspension components must remain stock. You may bolt or wire your A-arms down 5/8" bolt max.

Compact Truck Rules

- 1. Must be a factory 4- or 6-cylinder compact truck. 2wd only if 4wd front driveshaft must be removed. No engine swaps.
- 2 All glass, chrome, pot metal, lights, carpet, backseats, head liners, fiberglass, anything flammable (except front seat) must be removed before reaching the exhibit area. Do not break glass down in doors.
- Batteries must be placed in a secure position and MUST be covered with rubber floor mat or something non-flammable.
 Battery must be securely fastened down. Your battery must not move when checked. No battery packs.
- 4. Stock gas tank **MUST** be removed. **NO STOCK TANKS. NO PLASTIC TANKS.** The only exception is a bought racing fuel cell. Tank must be mounted inside of cage area and secured down with metal straps. No ratchet straps, bungee cords, plumbers strap, or metal screws. All tanks **MUST** be covered with a rubber cover or something non-flammable. All tanks MUST have secure cap. All lines and fittings MUST be leak proof and meet approval of Officials.
- 5. Tires Sixteen (16) inch max. tires of any make or manufacture may be used. Valve stem protectors are okay. No split rims. No bead locks or bead protector.
- Doors All doors and tailgate may have a total of 12 inches welded per vertical door seam NOT window pillar (3" x 1/8" max. strapping). If not welded, you may wire or chain in 6 places.
- 7. ABSOLUTELY NO FRAME WELDING.
- 8. Hood Hoods must open for inspection. Hoods must have two holes for fire purposes. You may use two (2) 3/4" all thread in core support six inch max. washer. In addition to bolts you may use six (6) pieces of #9 wire. You may have up to ten (10) bolts holding hood skin together.

- 9. Bumpers You may replace the front bumper but must be a flat bumper with six (6) inch max. material. You may weld bumper on NO welding behind core support body mount. Must be factory rear bumper.
 - You may replace the two rear bed mount bolts with 3/4" bolts. NO WEDGED REAR ENDS.
 - 11. You must bolt the cab and bed together in four (4) places. Max. 3/4" bolts, min. 1/2" bolts. Six-inch max. washers.
 - 12. A minimum of 1 maximum of 2 bars from firewall to roof in center of truck is required. No cross connections. Windshield bars can't be more than 3" wide, must be flat steel **NO** tubing or angle iron. 5" on firewall and 5" on roof max.
 - 13. You may run after market steering column. You may wire or bolt your A-arms down. All other steering components must remain stock.
 - 14. Bumper height must be 16" to 26" measured to the bottom of the frame at the back and front body mount location.
 - 15. Driver's safety cage A six-point cage may be placed around the driver's compartment, cage may extend into bed. Cage material must not be bigger than 6" diameter. Cage may be welded or bolted in. Side bars will not extend in front of firewall or farther back than 6" in front of rear wheel well. You are allowed a cross bar at the firewall, behind seat, and at very back of side bars. Down tubes must be straight down (max. of 4 down tubes, one at each corner) may be welded to flat part of frame. Front down tube must not be in front of inside front door seam. Cage must be a minimum of six inches above sheet metal. You are allowed a roll over bar. No grader blades or bars on outside of car. **THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**

CALF SCRAMBLE CONTEST

Rules & Regulations

- 1. To be eligible for the calf scramble, each contestant must have exhibited a livestock project (example Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Horses) at an approved Junior Livestock Show and been a member of 4-H or FFA in good standing in a previous year.
- 2. The Fulton County Fair Association, or the sponsors, will not be responsible for any accidents connected with this contract.
- 3. Each participant must be a member in good standing of a 4-H club or FFA Chapter and remain so for the following year.
- 4. Each participant must secure an application blank and have it signed by parent or guardian. It must also be signed by the local 4-H leader or FFA advisor that the participant is capable of caring for a calf and has proper facilities for doing so.
- 5. APPLICANTS MUST RETURN APPLICATIONS TO THE FULTON COUNTY FAIR SECRETARY'S OFFICE BY TUESDAY, JULY 27, 2021.
- 6. Contestants must be between 13 and 17 years of age on August 1 of the year the participant is in the contest, and reside in the area served by the Fulton County Fair. No prior Calf Scramble Contest winners are eligible to compete unless otherwise determined by the Fulton County Fair Association prior to the commencement of the contest.
- 7. Contestants must attend a meeting held prior to the calf scramble. At this time, rules will be explained and any questions will be answered. Halters will be issued at this meeting.
- 8. Contestants will be furnished a halter with appropriate lead rope. The halter or lead rope cannot be used as a lariat. The halter must be placed over the head in the usual manner, and the calf kept under control until a judge rules the contestant a winner. No other aids will be allowed. Participants are not allowed to grab the tail of the calf at any time.
- 9. While one contestant has hold of a calf, no other participants will be allowed to touch it. If two or more contestants catch a calf at the same time, the calf will be turned loose.
- 10. The Calf Scramble Committee will select referees and judges in all cases under protest. The judges' decision will be final.
- 11. These calves will not be allowed to be sold, traded, or disposed of, except by the consent of the Fair Association. In case of sale or disposition contrary to these rules, the winner, or his parents, will be responsible for the full values thereof to be returned to the Fair Association.
- 12. The calf must be exhibited at the Fulton County Fair Open Show the following year in any special class, as determined by the Fair Association.
- 13. All prizes, or prize money, won with this calf will belong to the contestant who wins it.
- 14. The Fulton County Fair Association reserves the right to take the calf away from any contestant who does not abide by all the rules, and who does not care for the calf in a good husband-like manner.
- 15. Committees of the Fulton County Fair Association will handle unusual incidents arising affecting continuation of this project.
- 16. Decisions of the judges will be final. In case of questions, arguments, or unusual incidents, the Fulton County Fair Association will be the final judge.
- 17. The Fulton County Fair Association reserves the right to, and may at any time prior to the commencement of the contest, interpret, amend, alter or repeal any and all rules and regulations associated with said contest without notice to the contestant(s). 
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
