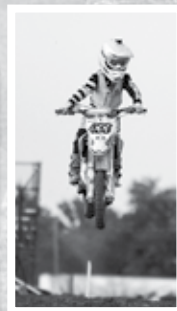

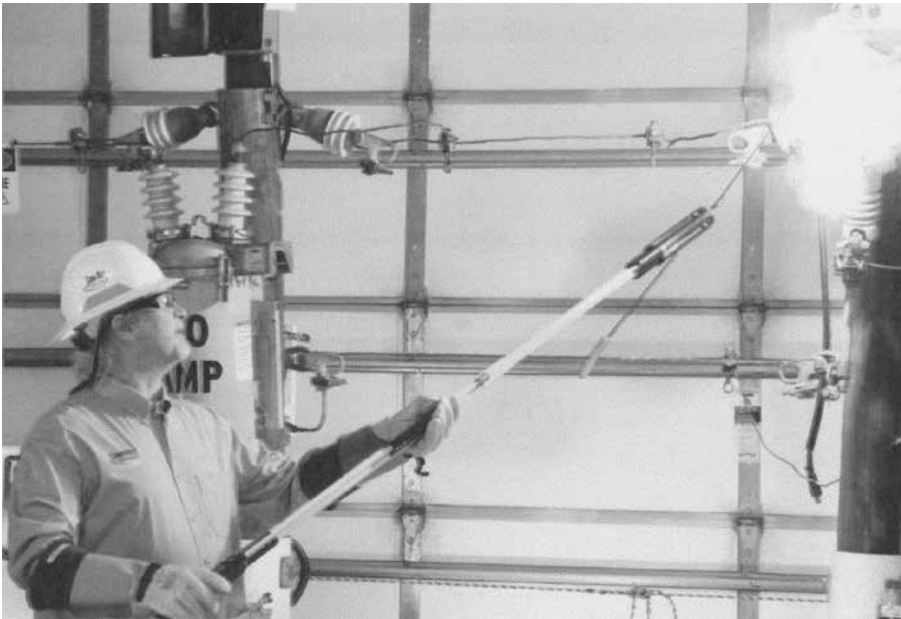

- If you have a fire you will receive a DNF for that round – two fires and you are done for the night.
- All vehicles must go through tech inspection.
- Vehicles will not be inspected on the trailer.
- You will draw for starting order.

- Must have a secure battery.
- Must have a secure and leak-free fuel system.
- Must have working brakes.
- Must disable or pull fuse from airbags.

Rules & Regulations

1. The general supervision of the grounds and the entire exhibition is vested in a Board of Directors.
2. The order of the President and Secretary will be executed by the Marshal and Committee of Grounds and Privileges, who have immediate charge of the grounds and assign such aids to Superintendents of Divisions as may be required, receive exhibitors on their arrival and direct them to their proper place, and see that none of the rules are violated.

Entries

3. Exhibitors of Automobiles, Machinery, etc. will be allotted space on applying to Superintendent of these departments.

IMPORTANT

4. Competitors will at all times give the necessary personal attention to whatever they may have on exhibition, and at the close of the Fair take charge of same.
5. **Diligence will be used by the officers of the board to prevent injury or loss of articles or animals on exhibition, but the Board will not be responsible for any loss that may occur.**

AWARDING COMMITTEE

6. **Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with the judges, during the judging process, will be promptly excluded from competition. Questions may be asked at the conclusion of judging. This rule will be strictly enforced.**
7. Protests against awards of judges must be submitted to the Superintendent, in writing, with sufficient reasons given.
8. The judges will report only the articles entitled to premiums in the regular list, except they may especially commend such others as may be deemed worthy of recommendation.
9. Should any doubt arise as to regularity of entry or any other important matter, which the judges feel incompetent to decide, they shall at once report the same to the superintendent of the proper department for decision.
10. Great care must be exercised to preserve the awarding judges' books, and the awards must be entered as above in plain, legible manner in the proper place, and the premiums will be paid on the authority of the entries only.
11. Superintendents will be particular to observe the following rules: Blue ribbons are designed for first premiums; Red ribbons for second premiums; White ribbons for third premiums; Pink ribbons for fourth premiums; Yellow ribbons for fifth premiums; Green ribbons for sixth premiums and Chartreuse ribbons for seventh premiums. They shall be affixed to the exhibit at the time of judging. Participation ribbons are available for all exhibits not placing. These are available upon request at the secretary's office.
12. Awards will be made by the single judge system; said several judges to be appointed by the Board of Directors and to report to the superintendent of respective departments at the time of the day affixed for awarding premiums on the lots on which they are respectively to judge. Objections to any person serving as judge must be submitted to the Superintendent, in writing, before making any awards, giving good and sufficient reason. Superintendents shall have the full power to act.
13. Decision of the judges shall be final except in case of fraud or protest. If any award is treated in contemptuous manner or ribbon torn off, the premium shall be forfeited.
14. Each Superintendent shall give instruction to the awarding judges before entering upon the performance of his duties as will enable him to decide all questions that may come in for consideration, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Association.
15. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent to have all awards complete no later than Saturday, July 25, 4:00 p.m.
16. All premiums will be paid by check.
17. All bills against the association must be itemized and presented to the Secretary without delay.
18. Delivery wagons will be charged for entering the grounds and must obtain a permit from the Superintendent of Concessions.
19. No buses or public conveyances will be allowed on the grounds, without special permission from the board of directors.
20. An efficient police force will be on duty day and night.
21. No persons will be permitted to remain on the grounds overnight except those holding special permits or exhibitors' tickets.
22. All subjects not embodied in these rules shall be determined by the Board of Directors, whose decisions shall be final.
23. Any person who by fraud or misrepresentation shall secure any privilege on the grounds, shall, upon the discovery of such fraud or misrepresentation, be ejected from the grounds and forfeit all rights to such privileges and to all sums paid therefore.
24. If animals occupying stalls of the Association are not exhibited in the ring at the time appointed for exhibition of the class or lot in which they are entered, owner will be charged \$1.00 per day for each stall and animals are not to be permitted to be removed until said rent is paid.
25. **All health papers will be checked before animals will be penned.**
26. All applications for renting refreshment stands, display space, space for show, etc., must be made to Victor Miller, P.O. Box 167, Lewistown, IL 61542, 547-2532. Ground rent for booths, etc., shall be established by the Superintendent of Concessions. When a lot or piece of ground shall be rented, the Superintendent of Concessions or Assistant Superintendent of Concessions shall make a lease in duplicate, both to be signed by himself and lessee, one for the lessee, the other to be given to or retained by the Secretary. The balance to become due and payable on Monday, July 20, 2026. The Superintendent of Concessions and Assistant Superintendent are to keep an account of all leases turned over to the Secretary and make a detailed statement of same in their annual report. Four admission tickets will be allowed with each concession privilege.
27. Advertising in the exhibit building, livestock barns and tents will not be permitted.
28. The Fair Association, at the discretion of the superintendent of concessions, reserves the right to sell exclusive rights for any soft drink, food, or concession.

OBJECTIONAL FEATURES

29. It will be useless to write or apply for privileges for gambling devices, questionable shows, or other objectionable features, as the same will not be allowed upon the grounds.
30. **No Porta Cool Units on any livestock.**

2026 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements – County Fairs

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits. All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.
2. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVIs shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. If an official electronic CVI is utilized, the exhibitor should be able to log on and show Bureau of Animal Health Personnel the completed CVI.
CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.
3. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.
Animal identification number (AIN): A numbering system for the official identification of individual animals in the United States that provides a nationally unique identification number for each animal. The AIN consists of 15 digits, with the first 3 being the country code (840 for the United States or a unique country code for any U.S. territory that has such a code and elects to use it in place of the 840 code).
4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
5. CVIs for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
6. CVIs for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise.
Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.
Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.
In the event of the suspicion of or diagnosis of a foreign animal disease, emerging animal disease, or other actionable disease, animals may be subject to quarantine on the fairgrounds until such time that it is determined that the disease is no longer a threat.
8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. Examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at any time while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit.
The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.
9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited. Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.
10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

IDENTIFICATION

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

Beginning in 2026, individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag ("840" tag). The tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

ILLINOIS CATTLE

Brucellosis – Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis – Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

OUT-OF-STATE CATTLE

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at:
<https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

BRUCELLOSIS

1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for

brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:

- A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
 - C. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified).
 - D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

TUBERCULOSIS

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted **within 30 days prior to exhibition**.
 - C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

ILLINOIS SWINE

IDENTIFICATION

1. Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
2. Ear notch identification is acceptable for all barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine. (Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)

Beginning in 2025, individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag ("840" tag). The tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

BRUCELLOSIS

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine.

PSEUDORABIES

Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

OUT-OF-STATE SWINE

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at:

<https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

IDENTIFICATION

1. Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
2. Ear notch identification **is not** acceptable for crossbred animals.

Beginning in 2025, individual identification of each animal shall be by a USDA official animal identification number ear tag ("840" tag). The tag must be able to be read both visually and electronically.

BRUCELLOSIS

1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
2. Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

PSEUDORABIES

1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
3. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies State I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
4. Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

IDENTIFICATION – Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

MARKET LAMBS

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

ILLINOIS SHEEP

1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

OUT-OF-STATE SHEEP

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at:

<https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

IDENTIFICATION – Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

ILLINOIS GOATS

1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
2. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

OUT-OF-STATE GOATS

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at:

<https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
2. Tuberculosis – Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. The CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

ILLINOIS EQUINE

1. All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
3. An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

OUT-OF-STATE EQUINE

All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at:

<https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

1. All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
3. All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

POULTRY

1. All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
2. Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds.
5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.
6. A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. Entry permit numbers are available online at:

CERVIDAE

(Deer, Elk, Reindeer, Caribou, Moose, Red Deer and other Related Species)

IDENTIFICATION – All animals shall be individually identified with an approved tag, microchip or tattoo. Elk are required to have two official/approved unique identifiers.

ILLINOIS CERVIDAE

CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE

For cervidae changing ownership or moving within the State, the owner must obtain a permit issued by the Department prior to movement

and the cervid must originate from a herd that is enrolled in the Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program or the Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Program. The permit shall be obtained no more than 72 hours in advance of the movement of the cervids by providing the following information:

- A) Name and complete mailing address of person exhibiting the cervids;
- B) Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease or Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Herd number;
- C) Name and complete mailing address of location where the animals will be exhibited;
- D) Number of animals and unique identification of the animals.

TUBERCULOSIS

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin test is not required for Illinois cervidae.

OUT-OF-STATE CERVIDAE

CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE

1. All cervidae entering Illinois must be in compliance with the Illinois Wildlife Code [520 ILCS 5]. For more information, contact the Illinois Department of Natural Resources at (217) 782-6384.
2. All cervidae entering Illinois must be accompanied by a permit from the Department and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that:
 - a. has been issued by an accredited veterinarian of the state of origin or a veterinarian in the employ of the United States Department of Agriculture;
 - b. is approved by the Animal Health Official of the state of origin;
 - c. shows that the cervidae are free from visible evidence of any contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto, do not originate from a CWD endemic area (any county and surrounding counties where CWD has been diagnosed in the past five years);
 - d. shows that the cervidae are not originating from a herd under quarantine for any contagious, infectious or communicable disease;
 - e. shows that the animals originate from a herd that has been monitored for at least 5 years under a state-approved CWD certification program.
3. A permit number can be obtained by applying online at:

Applicant for permit shall furnish the following information to the Department:
 - a. Name and post office mailing address of Illinois destination;
 - b. Name and post office mailing address of the consignor and/or source herds;
 - c. Name and post office mailing address of the herd veterinarian;
 - d. Number and unique identification of cervidae in shipment.

BRUCELLOSIS

Cervidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative brucellosis card or PCFIA test within sixty (60) days prior to entry.

TUBERCULOSIS

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
All cervidae twelve (12) months of age and over shall be negative to two (2) single cervical test for bovine TB no less than ninety (90) days apart with the second test conducted within ninety (90) days prior to entry. These animals shall be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period unless they originate from an accredited, qualified or monitored herd.
 - A. Cervidae from an accredited herd may be moved into Illinois without further TB testing provided that a certificate stating that such cervids originated from an accredited herd accompanies them.
 - B. Cervidae originating from qualified or monitored herds may enter with a negative test within ninety (90) days prior to entry and a certificate stating that the animals originate from a monitored herd.
2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. All cervidae shall originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to two (2) additional tuberculin tests conducted within 180 and 30 days prior to entry or exhibition.

RATITES

(Ostriches, Emus, Rheas, Cassowaries and Kiwis)

ILLINOIS RATITES

There are no requirements governing the movement of ratites within Illinois.

OUT-OF-STATE RATITES

1. Must be accompanied by a CVI and permit number. Entry permit numbers are available online at:
<https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.
2. Individually identified by leg band or microchip.
3. Negative test for Avian Influenza within 10 days prior to entry.

PIGEONS

There are no requirements governing the movements of pigeons within or into Illinois.

RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

LLAMAS

There are no requirements governing the movement of llamas within Illinois. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state llamas. Entry permit numbers are available online at: <https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx>.

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2026 FULTON COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SHOW

To Be Held At Lewistown Fair Grounds

July 20 – July 25

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

(please read rules for each class)

No livestock will be penned before 2:00 p.m., Monday, July 20

1. The Livestock Department (Beef Cattle, Swine, Sheep, Rabbit, Poultry and Goats) will be an open Junior Show only. It is open to all persons 8 years of age as of September 1, 2025, or in third grade and must not have reached their 19th birthday as of September 1, 2025 and residing in Fulton County, or attending a Fulton County School District, or who are serviced by a Fulton County 4-H Club or FFA chapter, that overlap in surrounding counties. The Agricultural Products Department, Corn, Grain, Flowers, Fine Arts and Culinary will be open to adults as well as juniors in the area as described above. Individuals previously enrolled as active members in Illinois FFA programs and turning 19-20 years of age by September 1, 2025 may participate in the Junior Livestock Division of the Fulton County Fair only if they are active FFA members as verified by Illinois FFA and in accordance with one of the following program options:
 - Maintain active membership on the roster of their local high school FFA Chapter;
 - Maintain active membership in a collegiate FFA Chapter in a post-secondary institution of higher education in the State of Illinois; or
 - Maintain active membership in an Illinois FFA Alumni Chapter.FFA members 21 years of age prior to September 1, 2025 are ineligible to show in the Junior Livestock Division of the Fulton County Fair.
2. **All livestock entries must be mailed not later than July 1, 2026 at 4:00 p.m.** These entries are to be made at the Extension office, and no entries will be accepted after the above mentioned date. **This rule is final and no exceptions will be made by orders of the Department of Agriculture.**
3. All rabbits and poultry to be penned by 7:00 p.m., Monday, July 20. All other animals to be placed and ready for exhibit by 7:00 a.m., Tuesday, July 21.
4. All vegetables and grains are to be in place and ready for judging by 9:30 a.m. Tuesday. Also all other Foods & Baked Goods, Class O & P, except Food Preservation must be in place by 9:00 a.m. Tuesday. All Textiles & Fine Arts classes, Handicraft, Class Q, all other Junior Dept. Class P and all Food Preservation are to be in place by 9:00 a.m. Wednesday. Flowers Class L are to be in place and ready for judging by 10:00 a.m. Thursday.
5. All livestock, poultry and rabbits must remain in place on exhibition until 7:00 a.m. on Friday, July 24, 2026. All General Exhibits, Floral Hall and Agriculture Products must remain on exhibit until 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, July 25, 2026. Trucks entering the grounds after that time will be admitted free to pick up exhibits. **Note: Early release to go to another fair is not allowed, nor is the superintendent allowed to release early. Premiums will be in jeopardy if these rules are not adhered to.**
6. In the following special rules which precede the various show selections, the lettered sections refer to the department; the number sections refer to the classes.
7. Protests against awards of the judges must be submitted to the Superintendent, in writing, with sufficient reasons given.
8. No single exhibit may be shown in more than one individual class.
9. Exhibitors please notice: All animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name only.
10. Registration papers will be required to be with animals when it enters show ring. These will be spot checked.
11. The Association reserves the sole and absolute right to interpret all rules. (Also to refuse and cancel any entry, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel award of prizes and declare show off if deemed advisable without claim for damages.)
12. Only exhibitors, or persons authorized by the Fair Board and Livestock Committee Chairman, will be permitted in the livestock areas or truck parking area from 12 midnight to 6 a.m.
13. Boys only will be permitted to stay overnight on the grounds. They will be responsible to adult supervisors for their conduct during the Fair. Those staying must provide a cot, necessary sleeping gear, etc. They must be in by 12:00 midnight and up and dressed by 7:00 a.m. There will be no leaving of the fairgrounds by those quartered in the area after 12:00 midnight without permission of the Livestock Committee Chairman. Boys 10 years and under must be accompanied by a parent if staying on the grounds all night.
14. Any questions about weights of any animal must be made at time of weighing. It is the responsibility of exhibitor and three other people, not relatives of the exhibitor, and presented to the Secretary of the Fulton County Fair and Racing Association 24 hours before they are exhibited. Protest must be accompanied by a \$25.00 deposit.
15. If it is necessary for someone else to show your animal you must report to your superintendent in the department and it is up to the discretion of the Fair Board as to whether it will be allowed.
16. In all Rate of Gain classes State Fair Rules and Regulations will apply.
17. **No livestock will be penned before 2:00 p.m. Monday, July 20, 2026.**
18. **No livestock after 10:00 p.m. Monday to 7:00 a.m. Tuesday morning. Must be in pen by 7:00 a.m.**
19. **All Feed for livestock must be brought in before 9:00 a.m. each day. No trucks will be allowed across the tracks after that time.**
20. **There will be no coloring or dyeing in beef, sheep, swine, rabbits, chickens, ducks, horses, and goats.**
21. **All pens must be cleaned before exhibitor leaves.**
22. **Health papers must be turned in to superintendent before unloading animals.**
23. **ONLY BEDDING OF PENS AND DELIVERY OF TACK ON SUNDAY, JULY 19, 2026 FROM 5:00 P.M. TO 9:00 P.M. ONLY AND THEN STARTING AGAIN ON MONDAY, JULY 20, 2026 AT 2:00 P.M. WHEN ANIMALS CAN START COMING IN.**
24. **SCRAMBLE CALVES CAUGHT IN LAST YEAR'S SCRAMBLE WILL BE SHOWN WEDNESDAY IN THE LIVESTOCK ARENA.**

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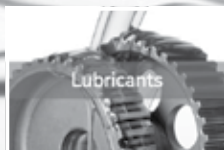

ENTRY FEE AND STALL FEE MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRIES

1. This class is governed by the above general rules.
2. State of Illinois Health Rules will be applied in this show to female beef animals.
3. **All Health Papers will be checked by the beef superintendents before cattle are unloaded.**
4. Superintendents will determine time and order of processing. All animals in recorded classes must have registration papers from the proper breed associations in the exhibitor's name. The papers will be checked at the time of processing. All steers, market heifers, and unrecorded heifers will be weighed on Association scales. Any objection of weight must be made at the time of weighing.
5. **Tattoos must be legible and fully healed.**
6. Double entries are permitted in the beef show, but limited to six steers per exhibitor.
7. Breeding heifers must have been dropped on or after Sept. 1, 2025 and no later than March 1, 2026. Beef steers and market heifers must have been dropped after Jan. 1, 2026. The animals must be the property of the exhibitors by May 1, 2026.
8. Livestock Auction cattle must be designated and weighed at the time of processing. Only cattle born in 2025 will be eligible for the auction.
9. An additional class will be provided for calves won in the Calf Scramble for trophy only. Scramble calves must remain on the grounds through Friday, July 24, until released by fair.
10. All cattle must be haltered and tied with a neck rope.
11. All market animals must be dehorned.
12. No additional stall fees on pairs.

14. All Champion heifers will show for the Grand Champion Female.
15. All cows in the cow and calf division will be British Breed, Recorded AOB, or Unrecorded. Exhibitor must be the owner of the cow at time of conception of the calf. All cows and calves will be halter broke and only one entry per exhibitor.
16. All class winners in the registered Angus division are eligible for blood typing in accordance with the American Angus Association.
17. If there are fewer than 3 entries in breeding classes, entries can be moved into another class at the discretion of the superintendent.
18. Market animals may be mouthed to verify age. The animal may not have more than one pair of milk teeth replaced by permanent teeth, and both permanent teeth cannot be advanced enough to be in wear. If the veterinarian or authorized person finds the animal over-age, the Association may disqualify the animal and the decision will be final.
19. For all pair classes, one entry per exhibitor and they must own both calves.
20. Each exhibitor will be limited to one entry in rate of gain.
21. **Purebred steers will consist of Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, or White Park. AOB steer will consist of all other registered steers. All other steers will be crossbred.**

Sunrise Farm Special will take place at 1:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 22.
24. Superintendents can use any stall unoccupied by an animal, if they deem necessary, without refunds.
25. Only one fan for every three head of cattle. Hanging fans only.
26. Grooming chutes must be kept inside of the barns until 2 p.m. Monday, July 20, 2026.
27. Extra Stalls: Please request only the number of extra stalls as follows per exhibitor: 1-3 head = 1 extra stall, 4-6 head = 2 extra stalls, 7-9 head = 3 extra stalls, and 10-12 head = 4 extra stalls. If there are not enough extra stalls for the exhibitor as requested, we will have to reduce the number of extra stalls bought with a refund due to you at the Fair Office.
28. **Steers must have health papers.**

6. All crossbred barrows must be farrowed on or after Jan. 1, 2026. Except rate of gain barrows must be farrowed on or after Feb. 10, 2026, which is also a State Fair Guideline. All crossbred gilts must be farrowed after Jan. 1, 2026.
7. All Swine Show exhibitions must be property of the exhibitor as of May 1, 2026.
8. **All animals must be ear notched, ear notches must be legible and fully healed.**
9. All purebred pedigrees will be checked and/or collected to determine classes. Purebred gilts must be farrowed on or after Jan. 1, 2026. Purebred litters must be determined at check-in.
10. Entries in the breed classes, including boar and gilts, must be purebred and registered in the exhibitor's name.

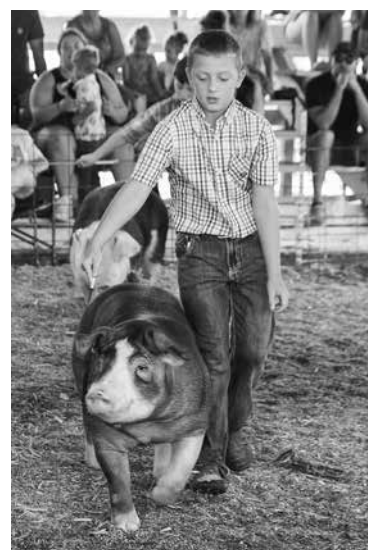

2. This class will be governed by general livestock rules and special rules in Department G, Swine Division, with the exceptions listed below.
3. This class is open to any exhibitor eligible to show at the Fulton County Fair who graduated from eighth grade in 2026 or under in age, who is showing swine for the first time at any county or district fair. Only one entry for each exhibitor.
4. This class will be for barrows and gilts (no boars).
5. All breeds will be shown together.
6. Youngsters who exhibit in this class are not eligible to compete for the regular showmanship swine award. Youngsters showing in Jr. Showmanship Award will not be eligible to enter Showmanship class.
7. Awards are \$20, \$15, \$10, and \$5 for the next eight awards.

1. The livestock sale will be held at 3:00 p.m. Thursday afternoon of the County Fair.
2. The starting site of the sale will be the cattle or swine show ring depending on the sale order of the species.
3. The sale order will rotate each year between sheep, hogs and cattle.
4. Intent to sell will be submitted at the same time as County Fair entries. Specific animals to sell will be identified at the County Fair weigh in. The auction is optional; exhibitors are not required to sell their market animals at the County Fair.
5. Exhibitors may sell two animals with only one of those animals being a calf.
6. Fees will be collected in the amounts of \$25.00 per steer, \$20.00 per pig and \$10.00 per lamb. This amount will be automatically deducted from the exhibitor's sale check.
7. For a calf, pig or lamb to be eligible for the sale it must meet the following qualifications:
 - Must meet the entry qualifications and be exhibited at the Fulton County Fair.
 - Must be shown at one other county show. (Cuba, Farmington, Fairview or Canton FFA Show)
8. County Fair check in weight will be used as the animal sale weight.
9. Sale order within each species will be determined by a random drawing with special recognition given to the champions and reserve champions if sold.
10. The buyer will not take ownership of the animal. The buyer will pay the difference between the "day's set market price" and the auction price. It will be the responsibility of the seller to market the animal. If the buyer wants possession of the animal for butchering purposes, that decision is between the buyer and the 4-H member.
11. All checks will be post dated for after the State Fair Livestock Shows.
12. If you plan to sell an animal at the Abingdon Fall Festival, the Avon Fat Steer Show, the Bushnell Town and Country Show, or any other local terminal show and sale, you will not be able to sell at the Fulton County Fair Livestock Auction.
13. All disputes will be ruled on by the auction committee, and their decision will be final.
14. Exhibitor must be 8 to 18 as of Sept. 1, 2026.

1. Bring exhibit Tuesday morning, July 21, 2026. All exhibits must be in place for judging by 9:30 a.m.
2. All exhibits must be grown, raised, or produced by amateur exhibitors. **Any exhibit may be cut or tasted at the Judge's discretion.**
3. An exhibitor is limited to one exhibit in each class, and entries may not be combined to be judged again as a group.
4. Fair will furnish containers for single variety vegetables and fruit entries. Exhibitors tags must be firmly attached to exhibits.
5. The market basket J-14-814 entry will consist of one bushel or one-half bushel **ROUND BASKET ONLY**, as the exhibitor sees fit, of vegetables from the exhibitor's garden. They will be judged on appearance, quality, arrangement, and balance selection. Decorating of the basket is at the exhibitor's discretion.
6. Pods should be left on all pod beans and pole beans. **Approximately one to one and one-half inch of tops should be left on beets, carrots, onions, and horseradish.** Onions should not be peeled. Husk should be left on sweet corn with an inch window cut on one ear of sweet corn exhibit. Stems should be left on tomato exhibits.
7. All vegetables and fruit should be clean, but NO waxes or oil shall be used.
8. Group display exhibits J-14-807 and J-14-808 are required to be displayed in cut down box or a small basket (decorating of box or basket is at discretion of exhibitor) and shall consist of 5 to 8 or 9 to 12 different vegetables and number of specimens must be the same as listed for individual classes. For example: 5 red potatoes, 1 cabbage, 12 green beans, 5 red onions, 8 yellow cherry tomatoes, etc.
9. Samples of grain seed and seed will be 1 full gallon. Exhibitor must furnish own container.
10. Wheat and Oats will be judged as current crop.
11. Corn will be judged as commercial crop.
12. A standard bundle of display shall be securely tied and not less than three nor more than four inches in diameter, approximately one-third distance from top and can be grown in 2025 and 2026. This applies to classes J-835-J-842.
13. Exhibits should be picked up on Saturday, July 25, 2026 between 8:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.

2026 RULES for Farmer Classes Only

1. Contest limited to rubber-tired tractors, no tire chains, rear duals or four-wheel drives allowed.
2. All forms of nitromethane are illegal (including nitrous oxide) as a fuel or fuel additive. Legal fuels are: diesel fuel, pump gas or L.P. gas. NO WATER OR ALCOHOL is permitted.
3. Tractors may enter only once in each class, but may pull in two classes.
4. Weight includes driver. All weight must be bolted or securely fastened to tractor. Front weight cannot extend more than 24" in front of tractors; rear weights cannot interfere with hitching device or sled. No weights above hitch.
5. 3" x 3 1/2" hole to hook sled.
6. **Hitch may not be more than 20" from top of hitch point and locked in place. Hitch point may not be closer than 18" from the center of rear wheels. Draw bar cannot be connected to the hydraulic system in any way. No excessive jerking when started or during pull. Pull is ended when all forward motion stops (no excessive hold digging is allowed). A hitch will be provided to hook from tractor to sled.**
7. All field stock tractors must be factory original models or have factory replacement parts.
8. Tire size is limited to 20.8x?
9. One turbo TO-4 or brand equivalent.
10. Stock fuel system for make and model. No exceptions!
11. No excessive stripping of weight is allowed.
12. All exhaust must be discharged upwards. No rain caps or curved pipes.
13. A tractor that does not go 75 feet will be given a second chance, except on pull offs when a tractor has only one attempt.
14. Contest will be governed by a judge or judges, with all decisions final. Judge will have the right to stop and disqualify any contestant's tractor that is being operated in an unsafe manner. Also if for any of these other reasons as follows:
 - a) driver does not remain seated
 - b) loss of weight from the point of pulling on the track (across white line) until ending pull and pulling off (past white line)
 - c) loss of any safety equipment
 - d) loss of any shielding
 - e) any time tractor or sled is outside of pulling track
 - f) if any contestant shows any unsportsmanlike conduct
 - g) if any driver has consumed any alcoholic beverage before or during the contest
 - h) all drivers must wear shirt, pants and shoes before they will be allowed to compete
15. **R.P.M.s for all tractors shall not exceed factory R.P.M.s for 6 cyl., 2500 R.P.M.s for 4 cyl. and 1500 R.P.M.s for 2 cyl. engines.**
16. **All tractors will be weighed by 5:00 p.m. that day at Fairgrounds and weighed before line up.**
17. Judges decisions are final.

6. All cars must have working brakes when you come for inspection. If the car is not able to exhibit the ability to stop it will not be inspected.
7. NO welding other than what is mentioned in this set of rules. If your car is found with any weld, other than what is allowed, and you refuse to fix it to the judge's satisfaction, you and your car will not run.

BODY

1. Remove all glass mirrors and plastic. Remove all decking in wagons. Vehicles must be swept clean of all debris.
2. No fresh or pre-ran sedagons, ZERO crease enhancement, ZERO sheet metal or frame shaping, forming or folding.
3. Deck and hood must be 100% in stock location and open for inspection. You may tuck trunk with a single 90-degree bend.
4. Anything can be removed; NOTHING can be added!!!
5. Fasten trunks, hoods, tailgates in 4 places, 2 strands of #9 wire or 3/8 bolts with factory washers to sheet metal only. 2 additional spots of wire may go from the trunk lid around the frame, 4 loops max. 4 spots of 2x2 angle 2 inches long with 3/8 bolts may be used on the hood or trunk instead of #9 wire. Hoods may have 6 places of 2 strands of #9 wire around header cutouts. You may weld doors 12 inches total on each vertical seam only 2" x 1/8" Strap. Driver's door (and passenger if you have one) may have a 1/8" door plate on the interior of the door from A pillar to B pillar.
6. Body mounts and spacers to remain stock and in place. If they are broken or rusted out, a single piece of #9 wire may be substituted. No body bolt changing allowed. Exception: you may replace two front body mounts with two 3/4" threaded rod with eight 3-inch washers and 4 nuts, bottom nut and washer must be inside the frame and may extend through hood. ZERO welding allowed to mount this rod. Core support spacer may be 2x2 up to 3 inches tall.
7. #9 wire or chain required in front windshield. You may also use 2" or smaller material welded 3" on the roof and 3" on the firewall, up to 2 spots.
8. Rust repair. The only rust repair allowed will be in the floor pans only for seat, battery box, and pedal installation! Rear trunk pans just around the body mounts. A 6-inch radius area. Must be 18 gauge or thinner material. Skip welded 1" on 1" off. 1" past rust. Again only the pans!!! Nothing else!!!

TIRES/WHEELS

Tires no bigger than 16 inches. No split rims, no studded tires. Doubled tires are okay. Any rim no bracing past factory head lip. No bead locks or solids!

FRAMES

NO welding on frames allowed.

1. No suspension modifications allowed besides swapping a arms and spindle to a direct bolt on off a car legal for the class. No reconfiguring or manipulating the a arm.
2. You may use 2 twist in spring spacers per side (store bought, no homemade)
3. You may use a single strand #9 wire to hold coil spring to rear end and leaf sprung cars may use 4 single strands #9 wire as leaf clamps.
4. OEM car coil springs only!
5. May weld 1 2x2x1/4 strap on each upper a arm.

DRIVE TRAIN

ANY drivetrain allowed with the following criteria.

1. Only the lower stock OEM car engine mounts may be welded to engine saddle only. You may use two 1/2" thick spacers to raise engine to clear steering components, may not exceed rubber mount area. You may extend off back of cradle but nothing excessive, 1/2" flat plate only (example SBC in Caddy, Mopar).
2. No tranny protectors or aftermarket cases or tails, stock mounting only, stock crossmembers only, or a straight piece of 2x2x1/4 in factory location. May use 2x2x1/4 angle iron 4" long for mounting. An ultra bell is the only modification allowed to the transmission.
3. **Rear End Swaps Allowed:** You may use any 8 lug or smaller automobile rear-end. No pinion brake protectors. The only welding allowed is to weld upper ears and lower mounts on, may use leaf to coil conversion lower mounts. Truss for upper ears may extend 2" onto the axle tube. Any axle allowed. Stock control arms only!! You may shorten control arms for pinion angle with 1" overlap no added metal! Rear-end may not strengthen car in any way. No doubling up rear control arms. You are allowed a lightly-braced rear end (call with questions).
4. You may run 1 piece of 3/8" standard chain from rear end around the frame OR 2 strands of #9 from rear end to frame, nothing thru body (#9 wire can have 2 loops, 4 strands together in center twist only). **One or the other, can't do both.** May also run a piece of 3/8 chain from rail to rail in the rear, may not be welded.
5. Aftermarker cable shifters, gas pedals, steering columns and headers are allowed; may have a connecting bar between the two, cannot support the hood in any way. **Clarification: None may strengthen car.**
6. Lower engine cradles and front plate only, nothing above the heads. No skid plates, carb protectors of any kind, no aftermarket parts of this nature at all.
7. You may swap engines, example: Chevy in a Ford.
8. Slider drive shafts are allowed.

DRIVER COMPARTMENT

1. 4-point square cage only with one 2x3 down tube to frame in the center of the door for protection only. Max. 60-inch side bars may be 6" wide and must be 6" off the floor measured at body mount floor height and must stay below the factory window lip. 6-inch max. cage material for everything but side bars. Halo bar is mandatory to back seat bar or floor sheet metal. Halo bar may

- be bolted to the roof with 2-1/2" bolts. Gas tank must be mounted horizontally and 4 inches off floor. All cage material 6" off firewall and 4" above transmission tunnel. **Gas Tank Protector.** Must be 4" from any sheet metal, 24" wide. May have 2 bars angle to your halo in a straight line; these also must be 4" from sheet metal.
- Driver's door **must** be padded. If you have a passenger, please pad theirs as well.
 - Gas tank and battery must be moved and secured. Tank behind the seat, battery centered in the passenger front floor.
 - Nothing may be mounted in a way that strengthens the car.
 - Trans coolers allowed. Must be mounted inside 4-point cage area.

BUMPERS

- You may weld on any loaded (loaded on inside only, nothing on the outside besides mounting pads) factory OEM car bumper, or a simple piece of 4x6 or smaller tubing with no point. You may weld the stock bumper bracket for the car in stock location the first 4" solid and in addition may have (4) 1" welds on the back side of bracket. Chrysler pointys must remain factory-appearing, no enhancing the front face with an air hammer or changing any geometry. Any questions ask!!
- Shocks may be collapsed and welded. All shocks and brackets must remain in stock location and extend 1" in front of frame.
- You may shorten the frame to 1" ahead of the full core support mount hole. (No cheating it back.)
- If you choose to remove factory bracket and/or shocks you may weld (1) 4x4x1/4 plate on each frame rail. Plate must remain on one side of the frame.

ONLY WELDING ALLOWED IS DOORS, BUMPER, ENGINE MOUNT, CAGE AND REAR END GEARS!

'03 and Newer Rules

MUST BE 100% FACTORY CAR SUSPENSION FOR A CAR LEGAL IN THE CLASS.

- Must use factory rack & pinion, no steering box conversions.
- Must run the factory aluminum cradle, NO added metal.

- May use bolt in strut spacers; cannot strengthen car in any way.
- A simple gray area or like cradle will be allowed. 1 bolt in each tower to hold in. Can not wrap the aluminum. Must be 2" inside the inside frame rail. Call with any questions! Repair plates may not connect to this!
- Must follow all other rules. Any questions call before assuming it will be OK!!!!

This is a simple build, keep it that way!

THIS IS NOT A SET OF RULES BUT A SET OF GUIDELINES OF HOW TO BUILD YOUR CAR. IF IT DOESN'T SAY YOU CAN SPECIFICALLY DO SOMETHING THEN YOU CAN'T.

JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL!!!

If you call me on these the answer is likely NO!

Do not get creative or read into the rules, this is a back to the basics build.

REPAIR PLATE RULES

Fresh Cars: (2) 6x6x1/8"

Plates must be 1-inch apart including the weld; 1/2" weld max. They cannot touch or be attached to the driveline components at all.

Pre-Ran Cars: (4) 6x6x1/8"

Plates must be 1-inch apart including the weld; 1/2" weld max. They cannot touch or be attached to the driveline components at all.

#9 wire on pre-rans will be allowed; 2 spots per window opening, and 6 spots elsewhere. Must be used in a twisted method to hold something. No using it to stuff between 2 objects.

Compact class cannot use their repair plates to weld the unibody and subframe together.

Full Size Street Stock Weld Rules

BODY

- No sedagons fresh or prerun.
- All bodies will match frame — GM to GM, Ford to Ford.
- No old iron bodies on new style frames or vice versa.
- You may change all body bolts and use up to 1" all thread. Body bolts may only go through frame and floor.
- No adding or moving body bolts.
- 2 core support bolts may be changed to all thread up to 1" and may use spacer between frame and core support.
- Rust repair is allowed. Leave the rust on patch 1/2" past the rust — do not abuse this rule!
- Body creasing is allowed. Quarter panels must remain vertical.
- It is understood that dishing the trunk will pull them in.
- No completely wedged or flattened trunks will be allowed!
- You may have 5 bolts in each quarter panel wheel well and front fender sheet well.
- No welding bodies to bumper or bodies to frame in any manner at all.
- Hood and trunk may have 10 3/8" bolts pinching skin to bracing may not go through body!

DOORS

- Front doors may be welded, solid vertical seams only.
- May have door plates, front doors only.
- Rear doors and wagon tail gates.
- 5" on 5" off material to weld doors 3" x 1/8".

TRUNK

- Trunk lid may be welded 5" on 5" off with 3" x 5" x 1/8" plates or use 10 3/8" bolts or use 6 plates 2 x 2 angle iron with 1/2" bolts.

HOOD

- Core support bolts may be changed and use up to 1" thread and a 3 x 3 x 5" spacer welded to frame not core support and have 6 places 2 x 2 angle iron 1/2" bolts or 6 places #9 wire hoods must be in stock position.
- 2 windshield bars required up to 2 x 2 angle roof to cowl only outside of distributor area. Weld 5" on roof 5" on cowl.
- No Rear Window Bars.

BUMPERS

- Any loaded stock or any after market that follows OEM dimensions.
- No added anti-climbers or kickers allowed!
- No pointies for rear bumpers allowed.
- Bumper mounting shock may be collapsed and welded. Must be in the stock location or you may trim frame to 1" in front of the front body mount and hard nose using a 4 x 6 x 3/8" plate 1 on each frame rail.
- * Preruns that fit the rules other than the length of bumper straps may run up to a 14" bumper strap 1 per side but they lose 2 patch plates.

DRIVE TRAIN

1. Any motor/transmission/rear end in any car.
2. Lower cradle and pulley protector only. No full cradles period! Don't even ask!
3. Header protector allowed, no distributor protectors.
4. Motor mounts aftermarket lowers allowed 6 x 6" mounting area 03 and up may use a bolt in steel cradle to mount motors.
5. Transmission braces steel bells and tails allowed (may not be locked in or designed to lock in!). If running a transmission brace floor must be slit from firewall to the tail of the transmission.
6. Transmission cross member must be stock automobile or a simple straight 2 x 2 x 1/4" square tubing mounted with 2 x 2 x 6" angle weld to frame.
7. Any rear end allowed. Floaters OK. Full bracing pinion brake and axle saver allowed. All bracing must be 5" from frame or body. Absolutely no pinion guards! (It is understood that pre-runs may not meet the 5" rule.)
8. No part of the rear end may be purposely designed to strengthen car or be used as a kicker or you will be cut! Judges decisions Final!

TIRES

1. No bigger than 16". No split rims or studded tires.
2. Bead locks OK. Full centers OK. Solids and foam-filled OK.

FRAMES

1. No welding other than bumper brackets, transmissions cross members, a-arms, down tubes, patch plates and motor mount allowed.
2. No shaping other than dimpling the frame rails.
3. Watts link conversions allowed — don't go overboard or you will not run.
4. Suspension — you may weld down a-arms with (2) 2 x 2 x 1/8" plates per side.
5. Stock spindles only and any other suspension parts may be swapped if it will bolt on like factory aftermarket tie rods allowed.

6. No hydro steering or steering box conversions.
7. Rear end may be chained down.
8. Leaf spring may have up to 10 leafs with (4) 2 x 4 x 3/8" clamps per side.
9. No leaf spring from coil conversions.

DRIVERS COMPARTMENT

1. 6-inch material max side bars 60" max 4 down bars welded to top side of the frame only.
2. Halo bar may be bolted to roof in 3 places.
3. Front windshield bars may not attach to Halo.
4. No rear window bars.
5. Gas tank protector must be 4" off floor and 2" from package tray 36" wide and as tall as the roof with 2 diagonals back to Halo.
6. Must be 4" from roof.
7. Drivers door must be padded.
8. Batteries, gas tank, transmission cooler, pedals and shifters must not be mounted to strengthen car.

REPAIR PLATES

1. Fresh 4X – 6 x 6 x 1/8
2. Pre-run 8X – 6 x 6 x 1/8
3. No patch plate may be attached or be used to brace or lock in a drive line component or protector.
4. If you have long bumper brackets up to 14" you lose 2 plates.
5. Unlimited wire on pre-runs within reason must be used to tie things together.
6. May not stuff between components.

** Any questions, call and I will try to work with you.

** Do Not Abuse these rules or you will not run. If you have a car similar but does not quite fit the rules, don't ASSUME it will run!

** Please call and I will try to work with you on this matter.

** All Judges rulings are final.

Pure Stock MWFA Rules

Compact Cars • Trucks • Vans • Full-Size '80s & Newer Cars

This class was created to have fun and be fun for the fans to watch. If you come with a vehicle that is built any more than what is listed below you will run with a different class or not at all.

1. Any 1980 and newer 2-wheel drive passenger car/mini-van/mini-truck/mid-size suv. 4wd vehicles must remove the front drive shaft.
2. All vehicles must be stripped of all plastic, glass, headlights, taillights and anything else that could fall off onto the track during the show.
3. All vehicles must remain stock, ABSOLUTELY NO WELDING ANYWHERE (other than cage).
4. Bumpers must remain stock, factory to that vehicle! Do not alter the bumper in any way. Factory bumper shocks must remain in factory location. You can run two chains or #9 wire to aid holding the front and rear bumper on. You may remove rear bumpers and shocks. There is NO WELDING to be done on bumpers.
5. Batteries must be moved to the passenger front floorboard area.
6. If the factory gas tank is in front of the axle you may leave it there. If it's behind the axle, you must move it to the rear seat area. Factory tanks may be moved inside but completely secured. Aftermarket tanks may be used.
7. All doors may be wired or chained in 6 places total per door.

8. Trunks, hoods, tailgates, all may be wired or chained in 6 places total. Sheet metal to sheet metal only. Nothing to frame or bumpers. If you remove the trunk or tailgate you lose that wire or chain. HOODS must have a 12-inch hole in case of a fire.
9. Rear seat bar or 4 point cage may be added. 60-inch side bars max. Fuel tank may be connected to the rear seat bar. May have a gas tank protector. 24-inch max. width must be 4 inches from any sheet metal. No rear window bars allowed.
10. The driver's door only may have a plate welded to the outside. This is for driver safety.
11. Any tires allowed (no solid tires).
12. No carb conversions allowed.
13. All suspension and steering must remain stock. You can use aftermarket shifter.
14. Headers are allowed. Absolutely no header protectors or anything attached to header.
15. All motor mounts must remain stock.

These rules are cut and dry, you should not have to call to ask many questions on this class. If it does not say you can do it then that means YOU CANNOT do it. Quick and easy build.

Rules & Regulations

1. **To be eligible for the calf scramble, each contestant must have exhibited a livestock project (example Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Horses) at an approved Junior Livestock Show and been a member of 4-H or FFA in good standing in a previous year, in Fulton County.**
2. The Fulton County Fair Association, or the sponsors, will not be responsible for any accidents connected with this contract.
3. **Each participant must be a member in good standing of a 4-H club or FFA Chapter and remain so for the following year.**
4. **Each participant must secure an application blank and have it signed by parent or guardian. It must also be signed by the local 4-H leader or FFA advisor that the participant is capable of caring for a calf and has proper facilities for doing so.**
5. **APPLICANTS MUST RETURN APPLICATIONS TO THE FULTON COUNTY FAIR SECRETARY'S OFFICE BY TUESDAY, JULY 21, 2026.**
6. **Contestants must be between 13 and 17 years of age on August 1 of the year the participant is in the contest, and reside in the area served by the Fulton County Fair. No prior Calf Scramble Contest winners are eligible to compete unless otherwise determined by the Fulton County Fair Association prior to the commencement of the contest.**
7. Contestants must attend a meeting held prior to the calf scramble. At this time, rules will be explained and any questions will be answered. Halters will be issued at this meeting.
8. Contestants will be furnished a halter with appropriate lead rope. The halter or lead rope cannot be used as a lariat. The halter must be placed over the head in the usual manner, and the calf kept under control until a judge rules the contestant a winner. No other aids will be allowed. Participants are not allowed to grab the tail of the calf at any time.
9. While one contestant has hold of a calf, no other participants will be allowed to touch it. If two or more contestants catch a calf at the same time, the calf will be turned loose.
10. The Calf Scramble Committee will select referees and judges in all cases under protest. The judges' decision will be final.
11. These calves will not be allowed to be sold, traded, or disposed of, except by the consent of the Fair Association. In case of sale or disposition contrary to these rules, the winner, or his parents, will be responsible for the full values thereof to be returned to the Fair Association.
12. The calf must be exhibited at the Fulton County Fair Open Show the following year in any special class, as determined by the Fair Association.
13. All prizes, or prize money, won with this calf will belong to the contestant who wins it.
14. The Fulton County Fair Association reserves the right to take the calf away from any contestant who does not abide by all the rules, and who does not care for the calf in a good husband-like manner.
15. Committees of the Fulton County Fair Association will handle unusual incidents arising affecting continuation of this project.
16. Decisions of the judges will be final. In case of questions, arguments, or unusual incidents, the Fulton County Fair Association will be the final judge.

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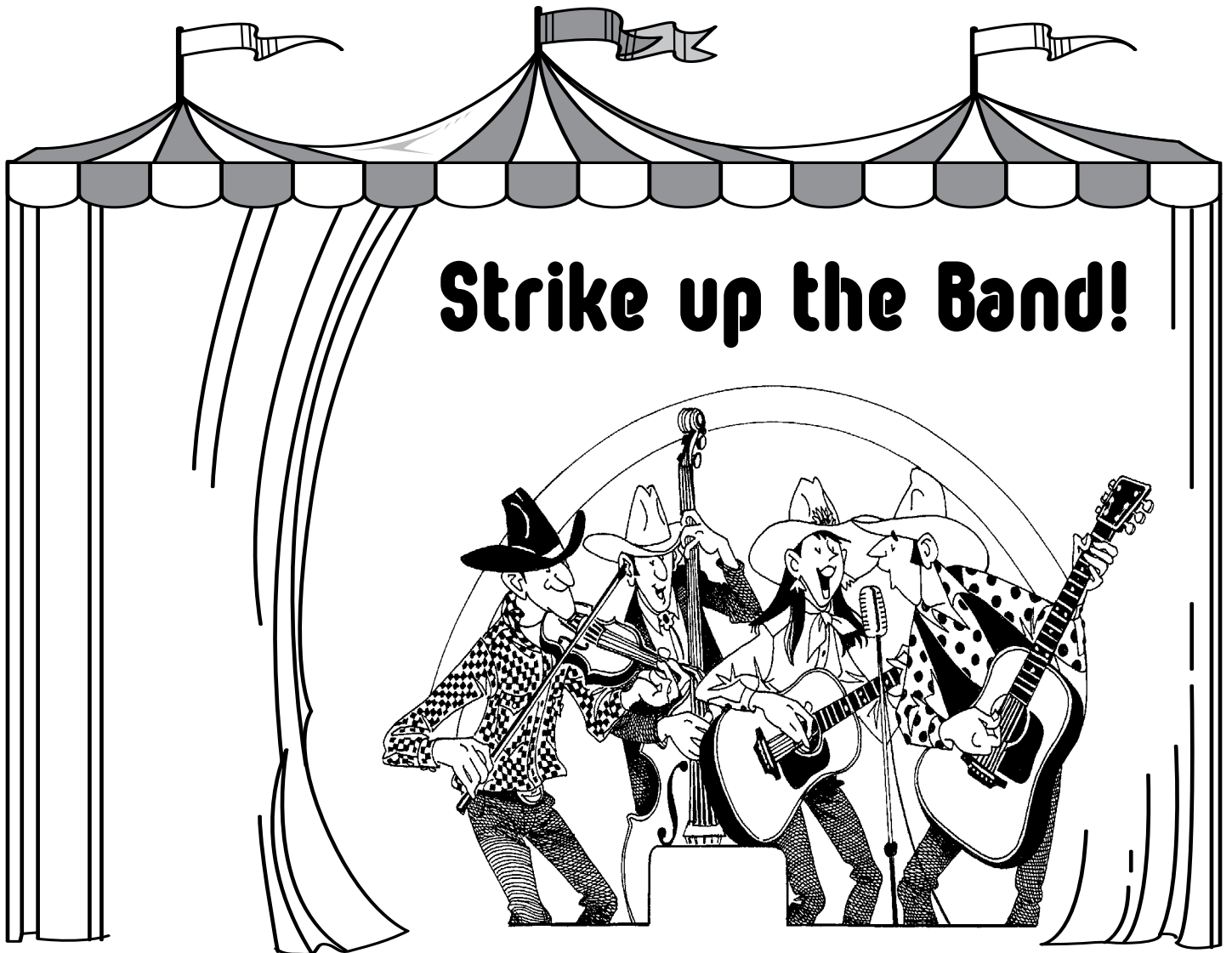
